## Psalm 106

Praise the LORD! Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever!<sup>2</sup> Who can utter the mighty deeds of the LORD, or declare all his praise?<sup>3</sup> Blessed are they who observe justice, who do righteousness at all times!<sup>4</sup> Remember me, O LORD, when you show favor to your people; help me when you save them, <sup>5</sup> that I may look upon the prosperity of your chosen ones, that I may rejoice in the gladness of your nation, that I may glory with your inheritance.<sup>6</sup> Both we and our fathers have sinned; we have committed iniquity; we have done wickedness.

<sup>47</sup> Save us, O LORD our God, and gather us from among the nations, that we may give thanks to your holy name and glory in your praise. <sup>48</sup> Blessed be the LORD, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting! And let all the people say, "Amen!" Praise the LORD!

- 5. Psalm 106 concludes Book Four of the Psalms. How does it serve as a good conclusion to this collection of Psalms? Explain.
- 6. Pray that we will not murmur or despise God's promise but trust in his steadfast love.
