

## Psalm 61 (ESV)

To the choirmaster: with stringed instruments. Of David.

Hear my cry, O God, listen to my prayer; <sup>2</sup> from the end of the earth I call to you when my heart is faint. Lead me to the rock that is higher than I, <sup>3</sup> for you have been my refuge, a strong tower against the enemy. <sup>4</sup>Let me dwell in your tent forever! Let me take refuge under the shelter of your wings! Selah <sup>5</sup> For you, O God, have heard my vows; you have given me the heritage of those who fear your name. <sup>6</sup> Prolong the life of the king; may his years endure to all generations! <sup>7</sup> May he be enthroned forever before God; appoint steadfast love and faithfulness to watch over him! <sup>8</sup>So will I ever sing praises to your name, as I perform my vows day after day.
